Through her efforts, Ellsworth advanced Indo-Pacific Command and Japan/South Korea cooperation objectives, securing coverage with 121 news outlets. She was hand-picked to forward deploy to Misawa Air Base, Japan where she documented several B-1B hot-pit refueling missions, leveraging international media to educate an audience of 100 million across the Indo-Pacific region. Due to her work, she ranked among the top 10 percent of deployers earning a BTF top performer award.

Airman Kenney comes from Clinton, South Carolina. She has been in the Air Force for a little over two years. She put on the uniform after her husband, Derek, finished his term in the U.S. Army as a Specialist.



#### **Staff Sgt Mekenzie Upton**

Staff Sgt. Mekenzie Upton is the noncommissioned officer in charge of Host Aviation Resource Management with the 28th Operations Support Squadron.
